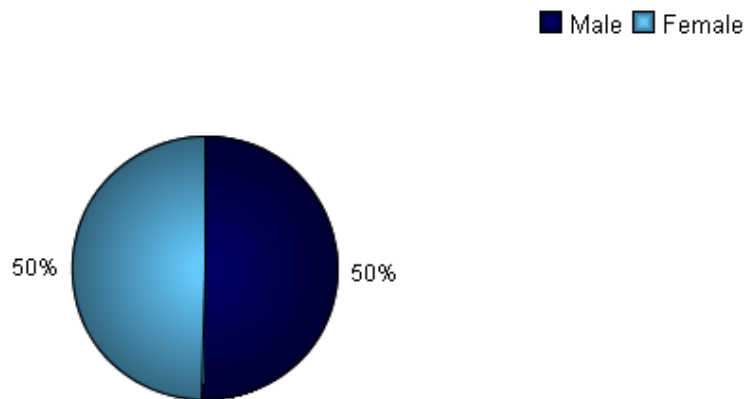

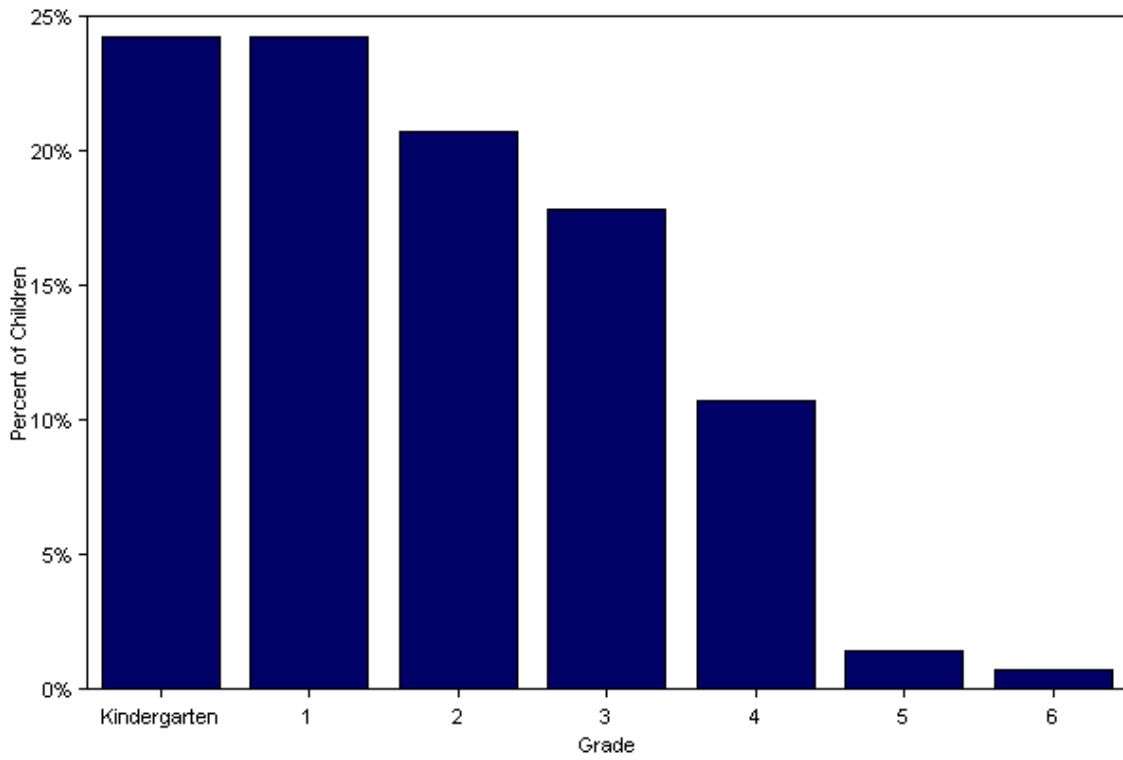

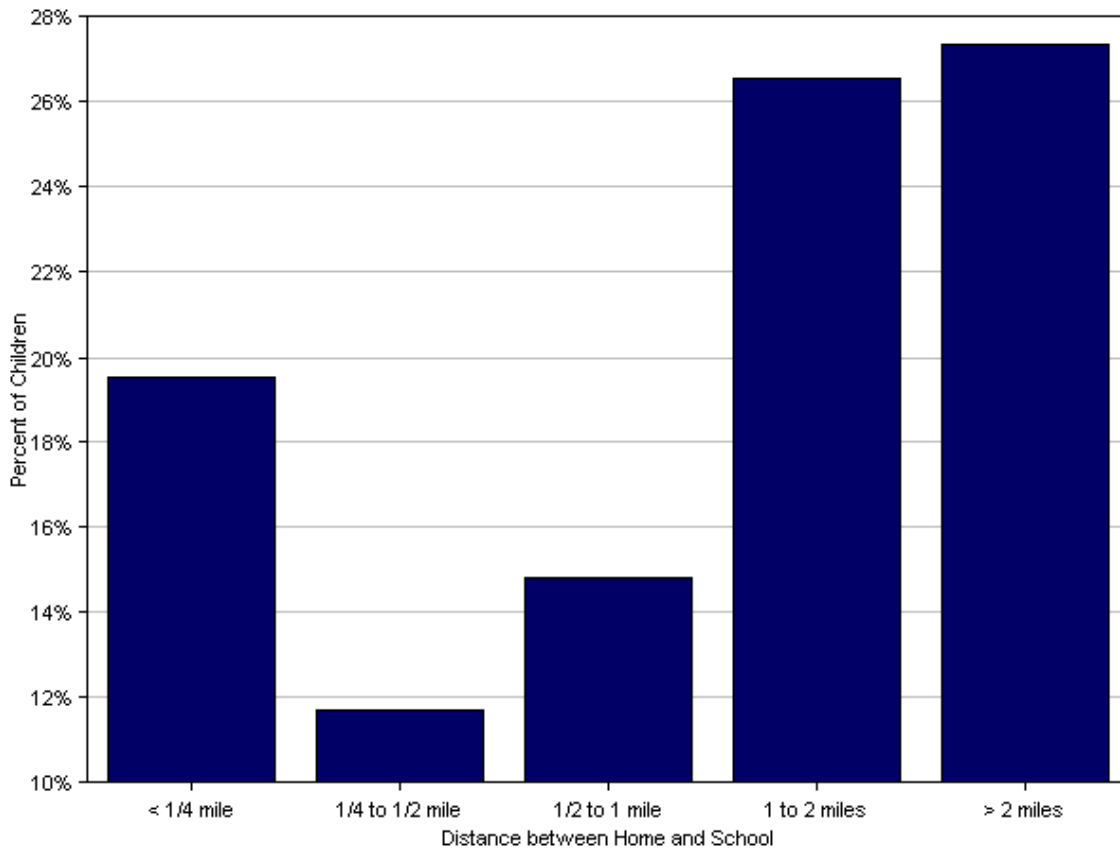

### Parent estimate of distance from child's home to school

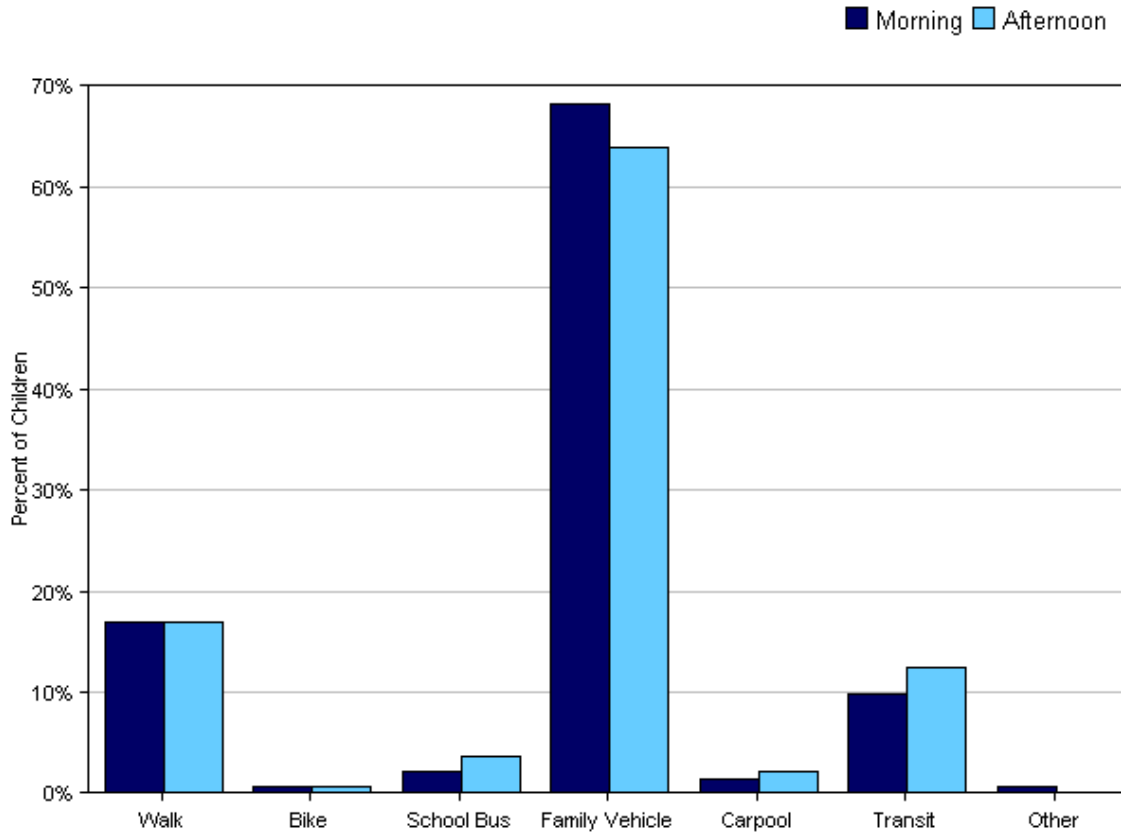

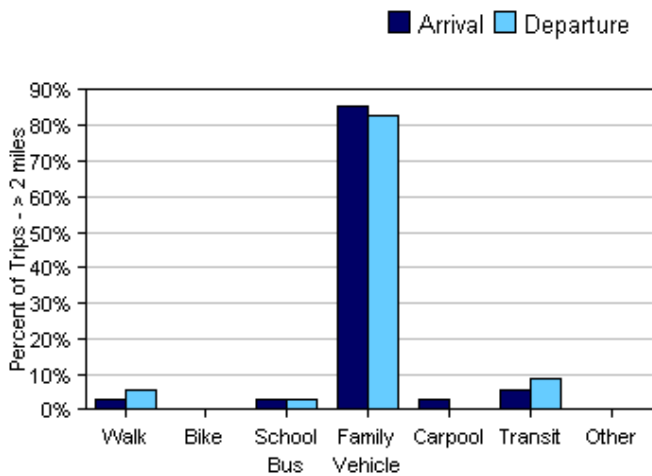

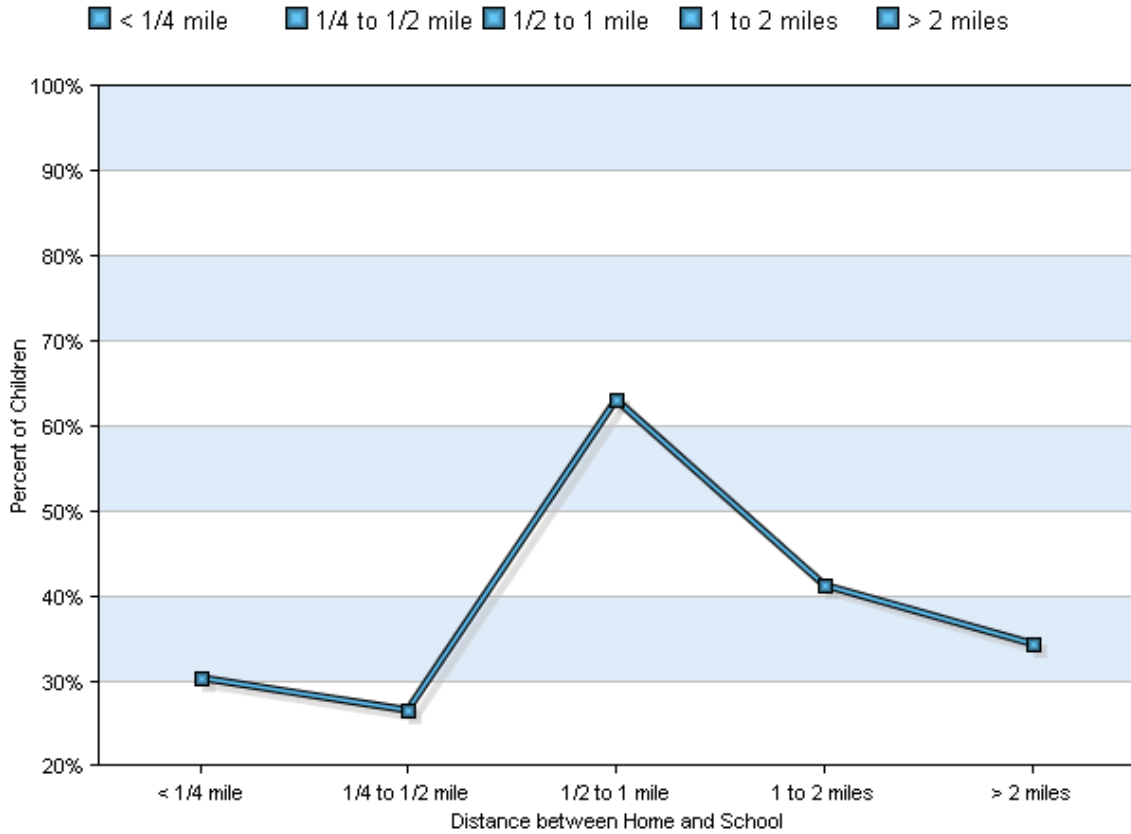

**Percent of children who have asked for permission to walk or bike to/from school by distance they live from school**

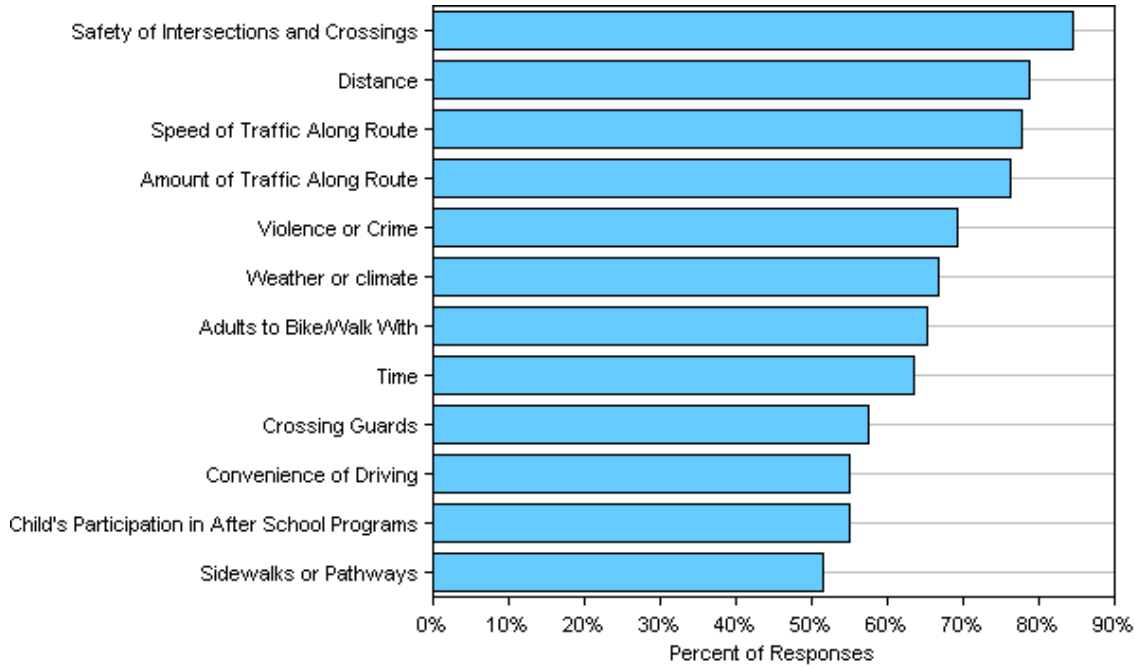

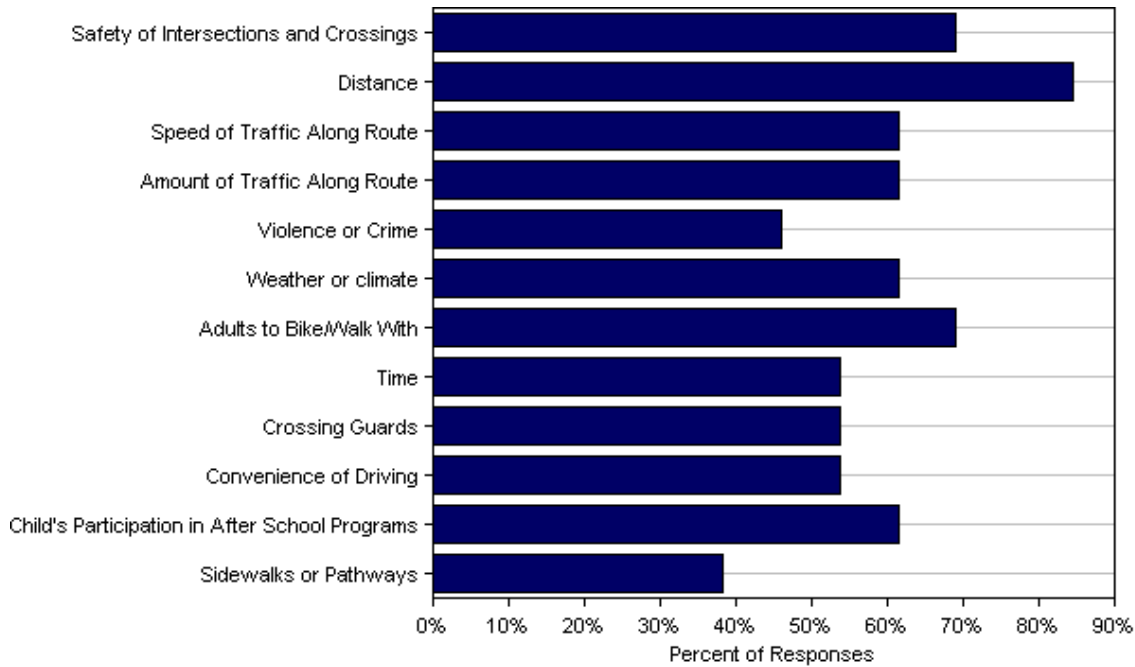

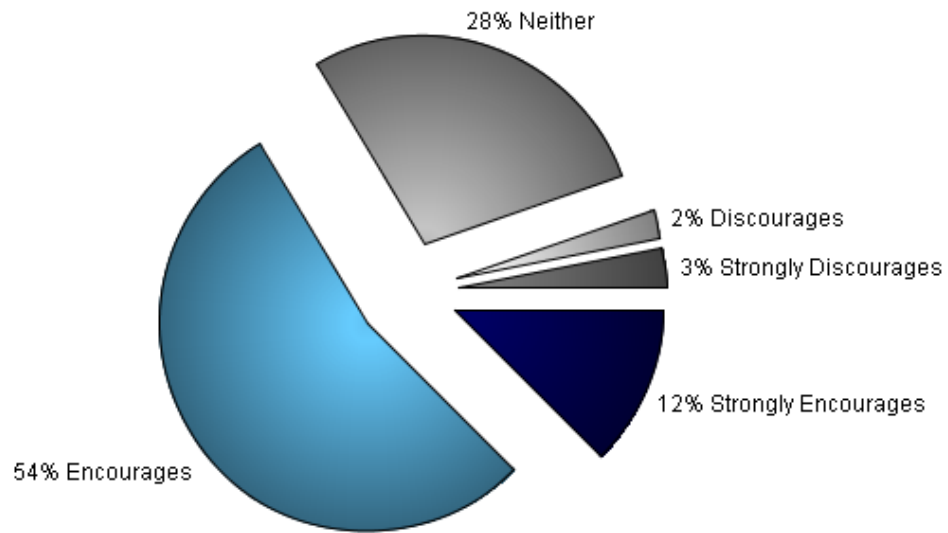

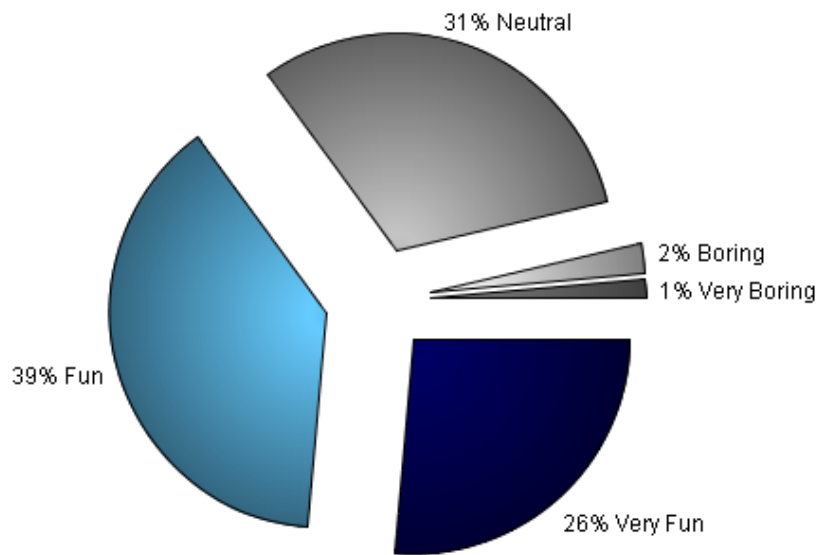

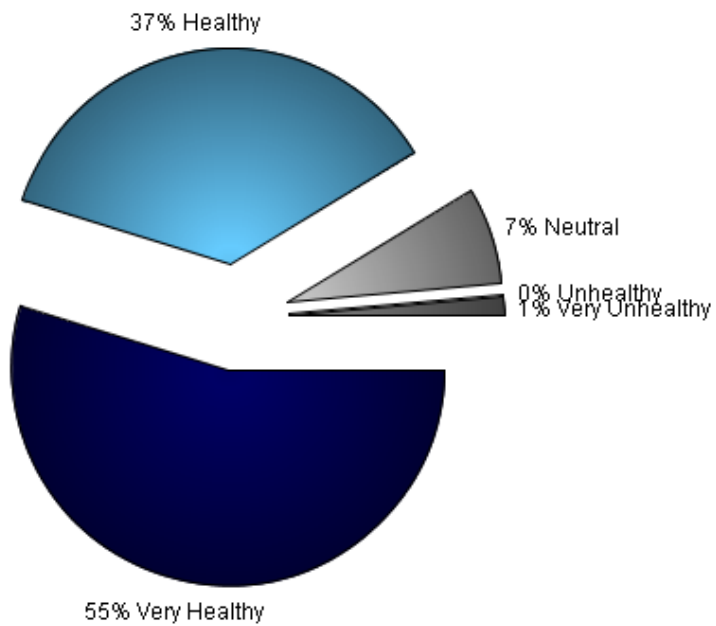
**Parents' opinions about how much their child's school encourages or discourages walking and biking to/from school**

587453	We live too far away
587476	Is very healthy walking or biking but unfortunately this city is not safe
587506	We used to walk a few blocks before taking the bus, that way we can talk about school and how was her class etc. Walk or bike to school it's really fun and healthy
587555	Sometimes my daughter and I walk to and from together. I would never at any age let her walk alone.
587605	We would bike if there were bike racks. We need crosswalk signs in the middle of the actual road like they have on San Bruno have in S.B. to slow traffic for school children crossing.
587640	My husband walks our child to school daily.
587646	Sunnyside policy of not allowing students to leave bikes locked at school makes it impossible for them to bike there. We hate driving as we're only 1.5 miles away but at this point that's too far for them.
587655	SFUSD did not let us send our child to the school closest to our house. This survey feels like adding insult to an injury. Distance and elevation difference makes it hard and time consuming. Public transportation is infrequent (every half hour) and unreliable. We would like to be assigned to the school next to our house. It is only 2 blocks away. We would certainly walk there.
593311	I would like to use a bicycle, but unfortunately I feel it's not safe in this city.
593647	The school does currently require the student's teacher to see the adult who is picking the child up, whihc seems to discourage children from traveling to and from school independantly.
593663	We don't walk home because my kids are too tired after school and we have a steep hill on the way home.
593665	My children are in K and this is too young to walk distance to school. Unlikely they can travel alone in city while in elementary school. Unfortunately.
593670	We live on top of a big hill so it's tiring for her to walk home plus she has a younger brother who can't make the walk.
593676	The lack of a true neighborhood school system in SF makes walking/biking to school very hard.
587455	Walks with an adult
587498	Main reason is distance
587521	There are approximately three dangerous, confusing intersections from my home to sunnyside. I would love o have my child bike or even walk to school but the entire route is simply congested and not pedestrian friendly.
587540	Sunnyside Elementary needs bike lock-up faciilities in order for kids to ride to school.
587629	What's the point of this survey
587668	One large hill and one small hill primarily prevent us from walking to school.
593675	We live on a very steep hill. Difficult to bike home. Walking is also a challenge. Normally takes 20-25 minutes to get home if walking.
593683	Too far.
587492	We live to far from school for walking/biking to school.
587502	Why is there no bike rack? We would bike partway if there were a place to lock the bikes. Tihs would help the parking issues!
587697	I would love her to ride or walk but she fights it. Time in morning is limited due to work/commute.
593656	I would let my child walk or bike if distance were not too far.
593682	My daughter she still too young to walk to school by herself. She still in first grade.
587450	The biggest influence3 on whether we walk is whether I have to take his younger sister somewhere afterwards

587608	YMCA should allow children to walk and sign themselves in/out. Sunnyside should have scooter and bike storage available.
587619	Both of my sons walk home on occasion from school. They hold hands when crossing streets. I would say once or twice a week, their father picks them up on other days.
587635	SFUSD policy of not letting children attend their neighborhood schools significantly impacts our mode of transportation. Our neighborhood school is a few blocks away on a much safer route and is completely compatible with walking/biking. Instead the lottery system forces us to attend a different school and drive more often- terrible system!!!
593654	More kids walking to school makes it easier for more and more kids to do so. Getting crossing guard on monterey would help- walking kids ALL THE WAY across the street.
587477	We LOVE walking to school. If her friends walked too, I would let her go without an adult.
587589	She is very young but if there was a group that walked or biked I would not mind alternating to the group 1 day per week.
593649	Please do not encourage our kids to ride on bike to school. Please do not put our kids life on risk.
587568	Too young!
